How We Work

The Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust is a voluntary not for profit organisation. We aim to offer high quality education at the lowest fee possible. All our Trust members offer their services voluntarily. No facilities of any kind are offered. A small group of full time employees carries out the day to day work.

In order to be sustainable the educational institutions charge a moderate fee which covers their operating expenditure. Scholarships, concessions are offered generously. For example the concession offered to siblings extends up to four members of a family. Teachers and other staff members also avail of fee concessions for their children. A special Committee examines applications and awards scholarships on need basis. A glance at the figures will illustrate the exact financial picture.

The schools are registered with the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education and children take the secondary and higher secondary examinations of the Lahore Board. The medium of instruction is English. Both Science and Arts subjects are offered.

All capital expenditure, i.e., construction cost is met through donations. The sincerity of purpose, dedication and trustworthiness of our pioneers has been able to convince philanthropists to donate generously to our cause and by the Grace of Allah this continues to be the case even today.

The Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust aims to equip the youth with modern knowledge and instil the values of our religion and culture in them. We aspire to raise good Muslims, patriotic citizens and in the case of non-Muslim students, young people with good moral values.

The schools offer co-education till primary level, then boys and girls are assigned to different sections so that they can be allowed to grow in environments conducive to their respective natures. Sports are an integral part of the school day. Academic and co-curricular activities go side by side. National events and religious festivals are celebrated with fervour with emphasis on understanding the spirit of the occasion. Good manners are considered important. Good citizenship, civic awareness, understanding of current issues are an important part of school life. Creativity in writing, science and arts is greatly encouraged.

Since academic excellence is an important part of the school goals, highly qualified faculty is recruited. Students with difficulties are offered remedial classes after school free of cost. We do not want our children to go for tuitions. This year pre-FSc classes were offered to APS students and others as well during the months after the exams so that they can get a head start for the Fsc classes where results are crucial for entering into the professional stream of colleges.



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Our Management

Having been closely associated with the Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust for several decades, I feel that I am in the position to claim that the pioneers and torch bearers of this organisation were truly fired with the Aligarh spirit. The small group of old students of the Aligarh Muslim University worked with full zeal for the cause of education in the country and philanthropists infected with their enthusiasm joined in with donations of money and time. Their followers, in many cases their offspring, have continued to strive for quality education at affordable rates. Our aim is not just education but education with values, with humanity, and with vision.

A glance at our Governance structure shows that we work in specialized committees. Each Committee consists of people who are interested in that particular area of work and also have some expertise. The central members coordinate and guide. The educational institutions are managed by professional staff under the guidance of the Education Board. All the members of the Executive Committee are volunteers.

Finances are managed by the Finance Committee that consists of financial experts. The Schools are independent and self-sufficient. As you will

see in the later pages we do not turn away a student for lack of resources. If they satisfy the school admission criteria we accommodate them with the help of scholarships and our own resources. The zakat money goes towards those who fall in this category. All accounts are audited regularly as the statement given on [page](#) will show.

Appointments are made after following the proper procedure: posts are advertised and the HR Committee after conducting interviews and tests makes appointments in merit. Employees' children are entitled to study at the school on concessional rates.

I would like to finish with the prayer that this Trust prospers and grows and may Allah SWT bless our endeavours with success.

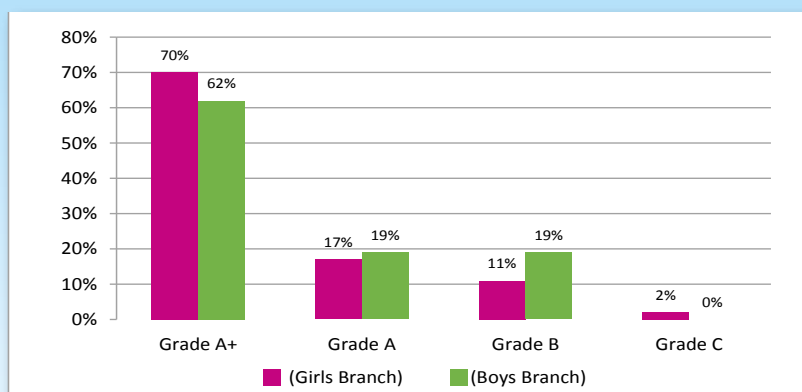

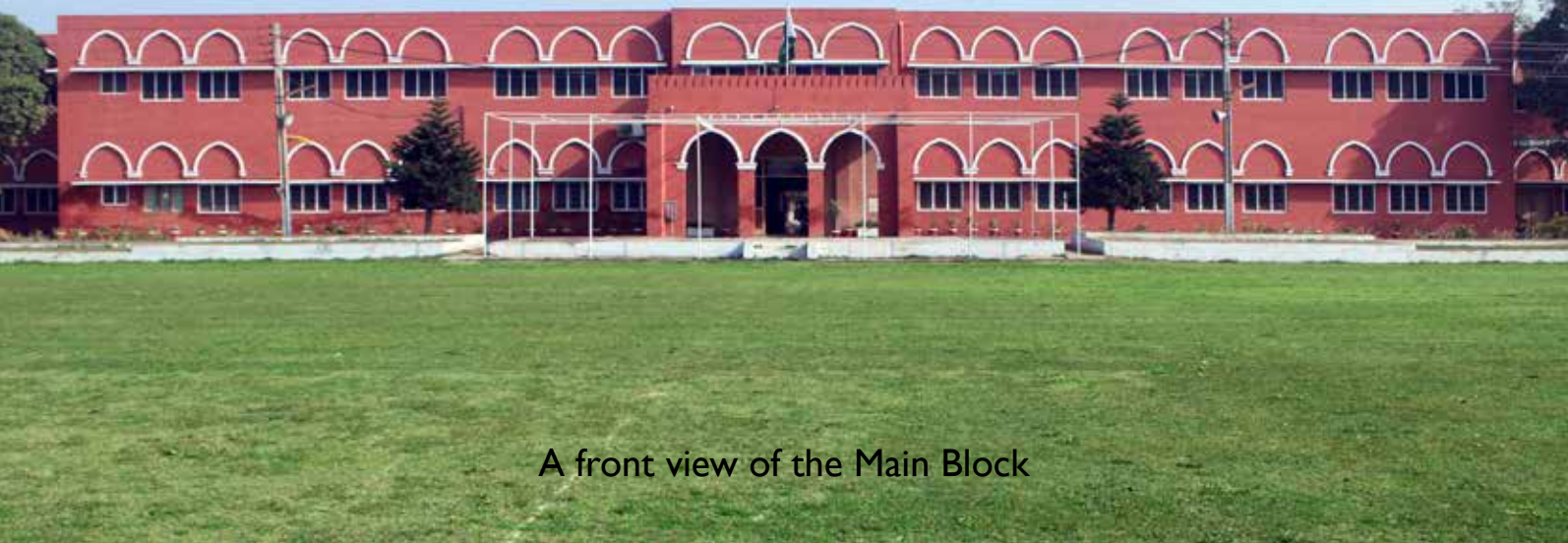


The Main School Buildings and Grounds

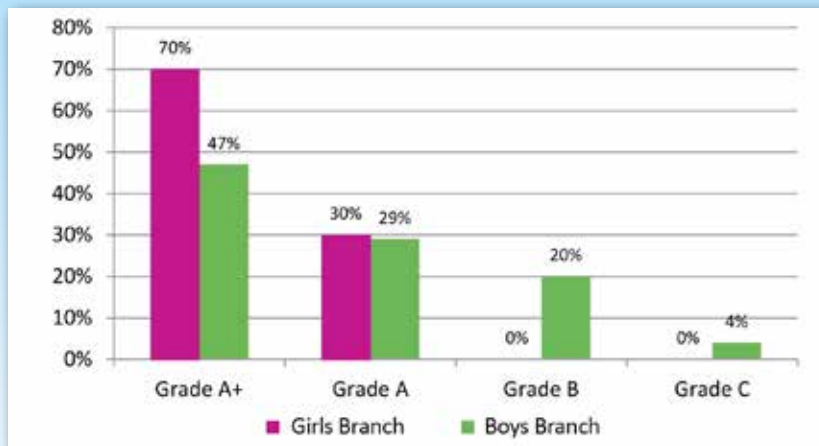

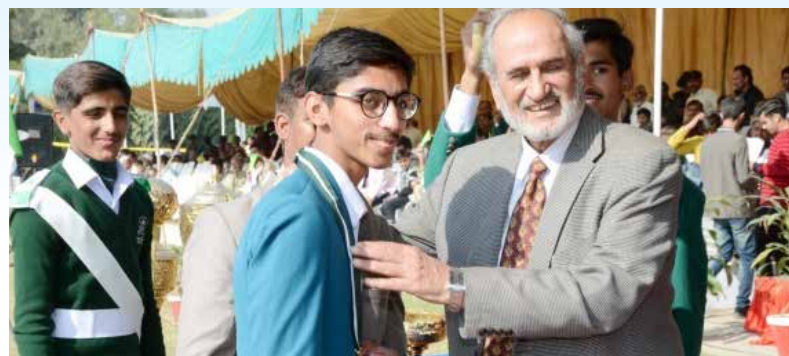

Aligarh Goes Green

In 2017 APS Manga had started the campaign titled Aligarh Goes Green and a tree plantation campaign was carried out. The students too participated enthusiastically and formed the Environment Club. The purpose was to help them understand the importance of planting and looking after trees. Many people planted a tree in memory or for the love of a dear one and the School looks after the saplings.

In spring 2018, the second plantation campaign took place. Mr Asim Bin Aziz donated 250 saplings of guava and orange trees which were planted by the Principal, teachers and the students. Hostel life: A home away from home

Aligarh Public School and College, Manga is home to 250 boys of different ages. Having boarders is a great responsibility and the School Management works out a balanced daily routine where studies, sports, leisure time have all a share in the children's day. Religious duties are not neglected and the students are expected to fulfil their obligations. National harmony is a major goal and the boys from different backgrounds, provinces and languages are encouraged to rise above regional prejudices and think of themselves as Pakistanis.

The boys live in five houses under the supervision of a House Master or House Mistress and Assistant House Masters. Meals are taken together in the Ayesha Sabri Dining Hall which has a capacity of 300 diners. Sports take place every evening with the Sports Teacher. Evening studies are supervised by subject teachers. Children who are weak in their academics are given extra attention by the respective teachers. Day scholars are also free to join the sports or remedial classes.

Boarders also get time to watch television in

the evening. Every Saturday a film is put on view for those who are interested.

Great attention is given to the character formation of the students. Sports and leisure time activities such as gardening help forge friendships and develop the personality of the young ones. In order to encourage team spirit and peer to peer learning trophies are given out at the end of the year apart from the sports, debates, qirat etc. The following trophies are awarded to the House for the overall performance of the boarders:

1. Academic Trophy for the overall best school results
2. Character Building Trophy to the best behaved House and one that excelled in extra-curricular activities
3. Housekeeping Trophy for the house that remained neatest during the year
4. Sports Trophy to the winner of matches and sports competitions
5. Quaid -e-Azam Trophy to the House that excelled in all areas
