The occasion was the Annual Parents' Day Function at the Manga Campus. The presence of these students at a school in Lahore, due to the generosity of our sponsors, is a shining example of cultural, regional and linguistic diversity blended into a national fervour.



Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust came into being to serve the nation in the field of education. We firmly believe that education is the key to progress, national well-being and raising good human beings. It was started by old students of Aligarh Muslim University who, fired with the passion acquired in their alma mater, wanted to share in the development of the country attained with so many sacrifices. Their enthusiasm and zeal were contagious. Like minded philanthropists gathered together to initially finance the schools. The first school started in 1965 in Lahore, the second a year later in Manga which was at the time just a rural area on the outskirts of Lahore. The journey continued. By the Grace of Allah, our sincerity has convinced sponsors to invest in our ventures. We offer high quality education at affordable fee and scholarships are given generously. In order to be sustainable, the schools are self-sufficient but all capital expenditure is met through donations.

I am happy to report that this year witnessed the completion of the G.M. Sabri Multipurpose Hall and the New Aligarh Degree College (NADC) building in the Manga Campus. Both are fully functional. The NADC building is destined to be the New Aligarh University Campus once Charter has been granted. The plan is to construct 5 storeys. However, finances permitted the completion of two only at the moment, which

fulfils our current needs. I am confident that with the generosity of our well-wishers we shall soon be able to continue the project. This year's proposal is to add residential blocks for the staff, renovate existing hostels and construct a girls' hostel. The last mentioned will be a first as well as an answer to a growing need.

Our efforts for the betterment of our students are not limited to hostel boys. Manga Campus is situated on 140 feet wide Main Multan Road where heavy traffic ply and students coming from the neighbouring areas have to cross this road to reach the school. Upon our request and follow up National Highway Authority(NHA) has finally constructed a pedestrian bridge right in front of the school gate, rendering it safe to reach the school. This bridge is proving to be a great blessing for the local population too. The bridge was inaugurated on 15th November 2025 and named after our objective **New Aligarh University Bridge**.

The Gulberg campus is a hub of academic as well as co-curricular activities. Situated in the heart of Lahore, students get numerous opportunities for personal growth, personality development and promotion of love for their country. Results are satisfactory and a perusal of the present Report gives a glimpse of the rich experience being offered to the students.

The Tehzibul Akhlaq Outreach Program (TOP) commenced 4 years ago, has proved to be a great milestone in the accomplishment of our mission. The addition of students from North Waziristan has brought the population of hostel students to 295. It is not an easy task to help these students adjust to a different milieu. Our staff rose to the challenge, bringing about a healthy change. Their hard work and dedication has brought about wonders. As I mentioned in the beginning, their performance in all fields can rightly be a source of satisfaction for the organizations and individuals sponsoring Tehzibul Akhlaq Outreach Program.

THE TEHZIBUL AKHLAQ TRUST

After the War of Independence of 1857, the great reformer Sir Syed Ahmad Khan visited Europe to observe their educational system with the eventual objective of improving and developing the socio-economic conditions of the Muslims of the sub-continent through education.

During his visit he came across reputed journals such as Tattler, Spectator and Guardian and was deeply impressed by the articles related to social progress. Realizing this as a step towards the progress he envisioned for the Sub Continent, Sir Syed Ahmad Khan decided to bring out a journal for the welfare and social development of the Muslims.

Inspired by Ibne Khazin Razi's famous book, the journal was named "Tehzibul Akhlaq". After the creation of Pakistan some members of the alumni of Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) called Aligs, who had settled in Lahore, realized that the need for carrying forward the Mission of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan was still equally necessary. With that spirit, Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust (TAT) was registered in 1961. Tehzibul Akhlaq was named after the title of Sir Syed's magazine.

Mission: To provide affordable and accessible quality education for individual growth, socio-economic development and nation building.

Vision: To establish and sustain institutions that offer quality education, nurture patriotism and inculcate moral values.

Theme: To create National Harmony by bringing students from remote areas and integrating them into the education mainstream of the country.

TAT is running the following Educational Institutions: -

1. Aligarh Public School, Gulberg, Lahore

The school was initially started in a rented building in 1965. It started as a girls school but later on boys were also admitted. With the pioneers' devotion and diligence and support from the donors, land was bought for the present campus. Now, it has 1125 students, both girls and boys studying in separate sections.

2. Aligarh Public School & College, Manga Mandi, Multan Road, Lahore

In 1966 the Aligarh Public School Manga came into existence, a residential as well as day school on the outskirts of Lahore, which spreads over an area of 51 acres. The Girls' Branch was later added. However, boarding facilities are for boys only. Today, it has 1692 students, including 295 boarders.

Hostels are the crown jewels of any boarding school system. Our Manga Campus offers boarding facilities from Class 1 onward. These boys, from different economic backgrounds, provinces and cultures, unite in their identity as Pakistanis and Aligarians. The five hostels comprise of five houses, each supervised by a House Master and an Assistant House Master. Meals bring every one together under the roof of Ayesha Sabri Dining Hall, which can seat up to 300 diners at a time. Students are offered nutritious meals keeping in mind the growing needs of boys.

Boarders are encouraged to engage in healthy, competitive activities including swimming, field sports like football, hockey etc. (lawn tennis being introduced soon) and housekeeping alongside more leisurely activities through its Environment Club.

3. New Aligarh Degree College (NADC), Manga, Lahore

Located in Manga Campus, NADC is a distinguished institution situated on a sprawling, expansive campus. Affiliated with the prestigious University of the Punjab, Lahore, it provides high-quality education to students from Lahore and nearby rural communities. The college offers a range of career-oriented and discipline-specific undergraduate programs, including BS Computer Science, BS Biotechnology, BS English, and BBA, with plans to expand its academic portfolio to meet evolving market needs and community aspirations. Supported by a state-of-the-art infrastructure, the campus features modern science and computer laboratories, spacious lecture halls, a well-equipped library, sports grounds, and a versatile G.M. Sabri Multipurpose Hall. Renowned for its academic excellence and strong reputation, New Aligarh Degree College continues to serve as an important educational hub in the region.

THE NOW AND HERE

The Trust began its journey with the establishment of the first Aligarh Public School in Gulberg, Lahore, in 1965, followed by another in Manga in 1966. Today, these institutions stand as symbols of commitment to quality education and character building. Both schools offer three years of preschool education, followed by Primary, Secondary and Higher Secondary Education. While boys and girls study together in the primary years, they are educated separately from Grade 6 to 12 in accordance with our values and traditions.



Currently, the Gulberg campus accommodates 1125 students, and the Manga campus educates 1692 students, including 295 boarders. The Manga School, being residential, serves a diverse student body from rural Punjab, Baluchistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Gilgit-Baltistan, and Azad Jammu & Kashmir. This diversity enriches our learning environment and reflects our dedication to promoting unity and national cohesion through education.

NAU is committed to provide world class education, fostering innovation, critical thinking and professional excellence. We look forward to shaping the future of our youth and contributing to Pakistan's progress. All our institutions operate in purpose-built facilities designed to foster learning, creativity, and moral development.

As we reflect on our journey, we remain grateful to our dedicated faculty, staff, donors, and well-wishers whose unwavering support enables us to pursue our noble mission. With faith, perseverance, and a clear sense of purpose, the Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust will continue to play its role in building a more educated, united, and progressive Pakistan.



INTRODUCTION:
 The Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust (TAT) was founded in 1961 by Alumini of Aligarh Muslim University India, settled in Lahore for advancement of education for middle class/poor people and preservation of cultural values. The Trust was registered in Lahore on 17th January 1961 under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. TAT established various schools and colleges such as Aligarh Public Higher Secondary School (Ghali), Lahore, Aligarh Public School and College Margh, Lahore, New Aligarh Degree College, Margh, and under construction New Aligarh University, at Margh, Lahore.

METHOD OF UTILIZATION OF ZAKAT:
 The financial needs of Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust are being covered by Zakat that individuals & others contribute. After verification of Zakat eligibility, the specifically assigned official of Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust requests permission to collect Zakat on behalf of Zakat eligible and to spend it directly on expenses of Zakat eligible as per the conditions of Zakat form. According to these limits Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust uses Zakat funds very carefully.

SHARIAH RULING:




The Faculty



TEHZIBUL AKHLAQ OUTREACH PROGRAM (TOP)

The Tehzibul Akhlaq Outreach Program (TOP) was initiated in 2020 which aims to bring boys from remote areas of Pakistan in its sphere of learning. With the help of the corporate sector and generous donors we announce scholarships in newspapers for areas which lack good educational facilities. Boys desirous of competing have to take a test organized by the National Testing Service(NTS). Successful candidates are interviewed by a team of school faculty in their home towns and are admitted. All tuition and boarding expenses are borne by the sponsors.

Sponsors commit to bear all expenses till the completion of higher secondary school as students cannot be abandoned midway through their studies. The sponsors receive regular progress report of the students.

The scheme has proved to be very successful. A glance at the table will show the number and areas of the TOP scholars. The modest start of 38 TOP scholarships has now Masha Allah reached 295. On the social and academic scale, the students quickly adjust to the environment and soon start taking part in studies, sports and co-curricular activities. Some of them have made remarkable progress. We hope that this will also fulfil our mission of promoting national harmony. Spending formative years together in the boarding erases prejudices and forms lasting friendships on a national scale.

We request sponsorship for new entrants starting in April 2026. As mentioned above the sponsors have to commit till the completion of the Higher Secondary School examination. There are two ways to sponsor a student(s):

1. **Sponsorship on annual basis as per the fee schedule, OR**
2. **A one-time payment of Rs 5 million for each boarding student.**

The latter proceeds (one-time payment) will be placed in the Endowment Fund and invested for safe returns. The annual yield of this investment will cater for the yearly fee of the student. Upon completion of his studies, this will be automatically rolled over for next intakes and hence a life time cycle for the Trust, perpetually in the name of the donor.



FINANCING PLAN FOR ADDITIONAL CONSTRUCTION

A. New Aligarh University (NAU)

University construction particularly as a solo effort, is a very challenging job and an ongoing activity. Till its operations becomes self sustained, regrettfully the construction is entirely dependent on donations.

So far work has been carried out on 2 out of 5 floors of NAU and G.M. Sabri Multipurpose Hall, with a total area of over 65,000 Sq. feet, at an approx. cost of around Rs. 600 million. The NAU construction includes 12 Lecture Theatres, Laboratories and Class rooms. The construction of remaining floors is planned for 2027, subject to availability of funds.


B. Girls Hostel

There is a pressing demand for a girls' hostel, which has become important due to NADC and upcoming NAU. Accordingly, a new ground plus three floors of hostel block for girls is proposed to be started in early 2026. The covered area is over 45,000 sq.ft at an estimated cost of Rs. 300 million.

C. Admin Block and Boys Hostel

The administration block was built in 1966. With the increase in students' strength, both extra classrooms and the office accommodation is also required. Keeping in view additional demand of boys' hostel, in addition to existing five, it is proposed to build an entirely new ground plus three floors block. It will cater to office space, classrooms and additional hostel facility. The covered area of this block is over 32,000 sq.ft. at an estimated cost of Rs. 200 million.

The financing model for the construction of girls' hostel in 2026, the Admin Block and NAU in 2027 is as under:-


Arshadullah (Dossali, Waziristan) Session 2023
